Course Description

This intermediate level remote course teaches SLPs and teachers of the deaf techniques for capitalizing on auditory information in children with hearing devices through use of the CID *SPICE 2nd Edition* auditory training curriculum.

Topics include: auditory development and methods to improve speech perception from detection through comprehension of connected speech.

- contrast auditory learning with auditory training
- describe the benefits of auditory training
- perform informal assessment of speech perception skills of students who use a hearing aid or cochlear implant
- develop appropriate goals and objectives for maximizing auditory speech perception skills in children who use cochlear implants and/or hearing aids
- develop appropriate activities for achieving auditory training goals and objectives
- identify different methods of data collection
- analyze children's errors and utilize strategies based on the analysis to develop children's auditory skills
